Join this sunset cruise to an amazing bird roost and nesting colony island nestled in St. Petersburg. The small mangrove island in Coffeepot Bayou provides habitat for a large and varied population of colonial waterbirds, including Anhingas, Cormorants, Brown Pelicans, Great Blue, Little Blue, and Tricolored herons, Black-crowned Night-Herons, Great, Snowy, Reddish, and Cattle Egrets, White Ibis, and Roseate Spoonbills. Although it is not nesting season, you will have ample opportunity to watch the behaviors of these birds while learning about their life histories and conservation status. Tampa Bay Watch's catamaran Discovery will leave from the St. Pete Pier and travel a short distance across Tampa Bay to Coffeepot Bayou.

Directions from Tampa area:

Take I-275 South across the bay to Exit 23 A, to I-375. Go East to end of I-375, continue East on 4th Ave North.


Turn Right/South onto 2nd St North, go 4 blocks south.

Turn Left/East onto 2nd Ave North. Continue East and if possible find parking along the Pier. Look for Gate 23 near the entrance to the Pier.

There is additional parking in the Sundial Parking Garage, 2 blocks away from the Pier, at 117 2nd St N, St. Petersburg, FL 33701.

From the south:

Take I-275 north to Exit 23B, for I-375 East. Follow above directions.
